Prof. Dr. Marion Schaefer is an expert in pharmaco-epidemiology and social pharmacy issues in Germany. Since 1998 she has held the position of Professor of Pharmacoepidemiology and Social Pharmacy at Humboldt University in Berlin,

Germany and since 2002 with the Medical Faculty/Charité where she is running the postgraduate Master Program Consumer Health Care.

She studied pharmacy at Martin-Luther University, Halle (Germany) and subsequently took tenure at Humboldt University. She has been visiting professor at the Schools of Pharmacy in Philadelphia (US), Utrecht (Netherlands), and at the University of Illinois in Chicago.

Specialised studies throughout Germany and internationally include compliance and the identification and documentation of drug-related problems as well as pharmaceutical care in public pharmacies for elderly patients as well as for patients with diabetes and hypertension. She has also developed strategies for the documentation and data management of the pharmaceutical care process in order to prepare pharmacists to contribute to disease management and integrated care.

Professor Schaefer is a member of the editorial boards of the International Journal of Clinical Pharmacy, the International Journal of Pharmacy Practice and the European Journal of Pharmaceutical Education. Other memberships include the Pharmaceutical Care Task Force of the European Associations of the Faculties of Pharmacy, and the Pharmaceutical Care Networks Europe (PCNE). Since 1990, she has been head of the General Pharmacy section within the German Pharmaceutical Association (DPhG) and head of the working group of Pharmacoepidemiology with a special focus on pharmacovigilance.

Within F.I.P she has served as the secretary of the Administrative Pharmacists Section since 1998 and was elected as President of the section in 2006. She enjoyed her international cooperation with pharmacists around the world very much. She initiated the "Drug policy project" of the section in 2001 which since then has developed impressively. More recently she became a member of the Counterfeit working group of FIP and chaired the Patient Safety working group.
